# Heather McQuillan Writing is NOT Brain Surgery

What if our young writers could:

(a) write with joy and excitement, then (b) look critically at their own work in terms of how they write, as well as what they have written, then (c) struggle with making the changes necessary to improve clarity and reader engagement? Well, then they'd be writers!



Many of our young writers have picked up on the writing myth that they have to get it "right" first time. Writing is not brain surgery! It can be a glorious and messy process and, thank goodness, there are key techniques teachers can implement to guide students through this process, enabling them to create original, exciting and relevant work.

In this session we will briefly discuss ways to free young writers so they are excited about getting lots and lots of first drafts on the page. Then we will turn to ways for them to approach selective redrafting with confidence and courage. Teachers will discover simple feedback cues to assist their writers and guide them to becoming 'redrafters' and therefore 'real writers'.

# Heather McQuillan Writing is Not Brain Surgery

#### Bio:

For a long time Heather McQuillan has been a teacher who wrote, now she is a writer who teaches. She was launched into writing novels for young people when she won the *Tom Fitzgibbon Award, 2005 and* recently developed her interests in short story and poetry.

In 2016, Heather won both the NZ National Flash Fiction Day Competition and the Micro Madness Award, and was placed third-equal in The Sunday Star Times Short Story Competition. Her flash fiction and poetry appear in a number of anthologies, including a micro story included in the international Best Small Fictions, 2017 due out later this year.

Heather is a Masters of Creative Writing student at Massey University and is working towards her first flash fiction collection as part of her thesis.

Through her role at The School for Young Writers in Christchurch, Heather works with hundreds of young writers aged 7-19, and in is passionate about guiding them and their teachers to better understand the joys and struggles, as well as the 'hows' and 'whys', of the writing process.
