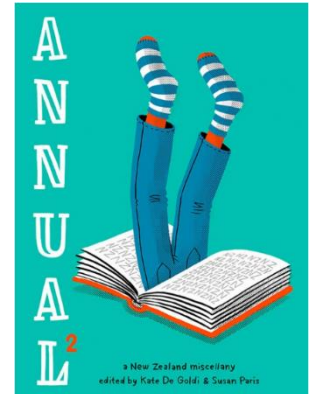


Wellington Literacy Association presents
