Raewyn was President for three years supporting others, planning events and looking for ways to support teachers share their passion for literacy with their students. Raewyn was President until her illness towards the end of 2017 became her main focus. She attended NZLA Annual Meeting in Wellington for a number of years as observer and then as delegate and made many friends across the country. Raewyn was passionate and outspoken about NZLA advocating for positive changes. She positively supported young teachers to join the CLA committee and hosted many committee meetings at her new rebuild home where she would throw together a meal for any wanting to stay on.

Raewyn loved shoes, clothes, bling, and was an enthusiastic shopper! She was quite the texter - her messages were entertaining and took some decoding. Fortunately you mostly understood the intended message and the passion from the woman who sent them! A strength of Raewyn's was her inclusive nature valuing all she met and worked with. She always lived for the moment, had time to chat or listen and didn't sweat the small stuff! Raewyn was fun to be with at conferences and always kept the focus on what we could take back to our own council.

2018 Storylines Tessa Duder Award winner

Tina Shaw from Reporoa was announced as the 2018 Storylines Tessa Duder Award winner for an original manuscript for a young adult novel, for her work "Ursa".

Her work is described as a powerful coming of age story. In accepting the award, Tina said it is part speculative fiction, part steam-punk, with some low level violence; an allegorical depiction of Nazi Germany. She is already working with the award sponsors, Walker Books, with the aim of launching the book at next year's Storylines awards ceremony.

In announcing the award, Tess Duder noted that the impressive number of entries received - 17 - represented extraordinary effort from all writers. She also noted that being able to announce a winner as well as three short-listed manuscripts demonstrated the extraordinary calibre of this year's entrants. (Twice in the seven years since the award was initiated, no entries have been deemed publishable, and no award made.)

Three other writers were shortlisted:

- > Graci Goldhart from Hobsonville, Auckland for "When never comes"
- > Heather McQuillan from Christchurch for "Even if your voice shakes"
- > Joanne Paulsen from Christchurch for "Fossil Farm"
